Fire Drill: A Huge Success!

On February 25, 2025, our school held a civil defense drill that underscored the critical importance of emergency preparedness and the serious commitment we have to protecting our community. The drill was carried out with utmost seriousness and extensive collaboration between students, staff, and local emergency services. Notably, the children were thrilled to see the fire trucks up close and had the opportunity to meet the dedicated civil defense personnel, making the exercise both educational and engaging. This interaction not only added a memorable, hands-on element to the drill but also reinforced the message that effective civil defense is a community effort, reliant on both preparedness and a shared spirit of cooperation.



Hot Weather Monitoring



As part of our commitment to student and staff safety, we monitor weather conditions daily to determine whether students can go outside during breaks. In line with our Severe Weather and Red Breaks Policy, our school clinic checks the heat index and weather conditions throughout the day.

With the hot weather season approaching, it's important that all staff are aware of how weather conditions impact outdoor activities. Extreme heat, high humidity, poor air quality, sandstorms, and thunderstorms can all pose health risks. When weather conditions exceed safe thresholds—such as a heat index of 38°C or above, poor air quality, or storm warnings—a Red Break is called. This means students must remain indoors or in shaded areas with modified low-intensity activities to ensure their wellbeing. Staff are promptly informed via the Hot Team Microsoft Teams channel so that appropriate adjustments can be made.

By proactively monitoring the weather, we ensure a safe and healthy environment for all. We appreciate your cooperation in following these guidelines to keep our students safe.

During the drill, our highly skilled lab technician, Sneha, expertly demonstrated the proper containment and cleanup procedures, showcasing both her technical expertise and adherence to safety protocols. This exercise reinforces our dedication to maintaining a secure environment, especially when working with potentially hazardous materials.

We were also honored to have Ms. Maha, the Health and Safety Manager at Taaleem, join us for the drill. She was impressed by the quick and effective actions of both our staff and students in responding to the emergency procedures.


