As an international school, we recognise that students have diverse aspirations, and by offering both the IB DP and IB CP, we provide personalised learning experiences that support different pathways to success. The IB CP is particularly valuable as it balances academic and career-related learning, enables specialisation in fields such as business, technology, and the creative industries, and fosters essential 21st-century skills like collaboration and problem-solving. Over the coming months, we will share more about the specific BTEC pathways we will offer, reinforcing our mission to "Open Doors to Opportunities" and ensuring every student is prepared for university and beyond.

Online video training on Risk Assessments

During our HSE committee meeting last week, one of the key actions discussed was the creation of a video to provide guidance on how to effectively use and develop risk assessments for trips, events, and activities. These videos have been made available for you to watch through the link here. This ensures that we maintain a high level of safety and preparedness in all our activities.



Ramadan School Arrangements

As we embrace the holy month of Ramadan, our school has put in place several key measures to ensure the safety, health, and well-being of all our students and staff. Below are the updates and arrangements for the upcoming weeks:

PHE Class Adjustments

The Physical and Health Education (PHE) department has thoughtfully adjusted its curriculum to ensure a balanced approach to physical activity during Ramadan, catering to the energy levels of our students while maintaining engagement and learning. These adaptations are made for both primary and secondary students, with careful consideration for their individual needs during this time.

Primary Students:

For our younger students, we recognize the importance of ensuring their well-being during Ramadan. If primary students are fasting, we allow them to take a rest when needed. In addition, if parents prefer that their children do not swim during this time, we fully respect their wishes. For Grade 5, where a higher number of students may be fasting, the games will be adjusted to include more low-intensity options, ensuring all students can participate comfortably while respecting their fasting status.

Secondary Students:

- Grade 6 & 7: The focus is on movement exploration through lowimpact activities such as dance and martial arts tutorials.
 Students are encouraged to engage in movement while reflecting on their experience through written reflections.
- Grade 8: Students will focus on coaching and leading inclusive sports, which foster leadership and communication skills. The emphasis is on teaching sports to peers, promoting teamwork over high-intensity activity.
- Grade 9: Activities are designed to facilitate participation in sports with strategic positioning to ensure low to moderate physical exertion. For example, roles in netball and volleyball that require less continuous movement will be emphasized.
- Grade 10: Students will focus on performance-based activities like practicing for STOMP-inspired performances, where creativity, rhythm, and synchronization take precedence over physical exertion.

Break and Canteen Timing Adjustments

Given the change in school hours (from 9 AM to 2 PM) during Ramadan, we have revised break and canteen times to ensure students are rested:

- Secondary Lunch Times:
 - Fridays: 9:45 AM to 10:00 AM
 - Monday to Thursday: 11:30 AM to 12:00 PM
- Primary Break Times:
 - AM break: 10:30 AM to 11 AM (Mon Fri)
 - PM Break: 12:30 to 1PM (Mon Thurs)



To respect our fasting students and staff, we have set up designated rooms with water dispensers to ensure hydration while maintaining the sanctity of fasting. These rooms are located in the following areas:

- F1-12
- G1-16
- F2-15
- F2-06
- G2-11



Additionally, specific arrangements have been made for the ground floor to ensure easy access to water while maintaining respect for those who are fasting.

Bus Inspections - February

Our February bus inspections have been completed, ensuring that safety standards remain a priority. Regular checks help maintain safe and reliable transportation for our students and staff.

DID YOU KNOW?

Bus safety is a shared responsibility, with multiple layers of inspections in place:

- Emirates Transport conducts its own technical inspections to ensure buses meet regulatory standards.
- School-Level Checks include daily routine inspections to identify any immediate concerns.
- Monthly Formal Inspections are carried out to review key safety areas:
- External: Mirrors, cameras, window tint, tyre condition, school name visibility, stop arm, reverse light buzzer, and more.
- Internal: Seatbelts, cleanliness, seats, cameras, air conditioning, firefighting equipment, first aid kits, and more.

This Wednesday, we will hold our monthly meeting with Emirates Transport to review student transportation services. This allows us to address any issues and ensure ongoing improvements in safety, efficiency, and reliability.

Pest Control Treatment

As part of our ongoing efforts to maintain a safe and healthy environment, we worked with our pest control contractor, to carry out a thorough treatment of our school buildings last Sunday. This regular treatment helps to ensure that our facilities remain free from pests, providing a clean and safe space for everyone.







Successful Facilities Audit: 95.7% Score Achieved



Recent Facilities Inspection Results:

We are pleased to share that our recent facilities inspection, carried out by colleagues from Taaleem Central Office, was a success! We scored an impressive 95.7% in this audit. The inspection covered several key safety areas, including:

- Water pipe insulation in good condition
- Power cables securely fastened
- External cracks were compliant with safety standards
- Shades and pergolas securely anchored
- Fire evacuation plans prominently displayed
- Sharp edges and corners protected

These positive results reflect our ongoing commitment to maintaining a safe and well-maintained environment for everyone. A big thank you to all those involved in ensuring our facilities meet high safety standards!



Did you know?

Our school has complex 9 chiller systems, which are critical assets that work behind the scenes to keep our campus safe, comfortable, and functional

Chillers play a crucial role in our HVAC (Heating, Ventilation, and Air Conditioning) system, working to keep our classrooms, offices, and shared spaces at optimal temperatures. These chillers circulate chilled water through our HVAC system, regulating indoor temperatures and maintaining good air quality.

As the summer months approach, these chillers play a vital role in maintaining indoor temperatures, air quality, and overall well-being for students and staff.

Our Facilities Team carries out routine maintenance, filter cleaning, refrigerant checks, and system inspections to ensure they operate efficiently and prevent disruptions.
