When conflicts arise, we focus on dialogue and reconciliation rather than punishment, using restorative circles and guided conversations to help students reflect, understand their impact, and actively repair relationships. Beyond the classroom, our OSRAH house system fosters belonging, teamwork, and mentorship, reinforcing our commitment to a supportive, family-like school environment.

Our diverse community of over 90 nationalities and 40 mother languages provides a unique opportunity to build meaningful connections. Parents play a crucial role in shaping how children engage in relationships, especially in an international school setting where students develop global perspectives. Encouraging friendships across cultures, prioritizing family bonding, and modeling positive conflict resolution help children develop strong relational skills. As a school, we celebrate relationships through buddy reading, group projects, and restorative circles, reinforcing the belief that learning goes beyond academics—it is about the bonds we build. Next week, our Annual Community Iftar will be a wonderful opportunity to come together, reflect, and strengthen the connections that make KCC a truly special place.

Safety First: Think Hazards, Think Control

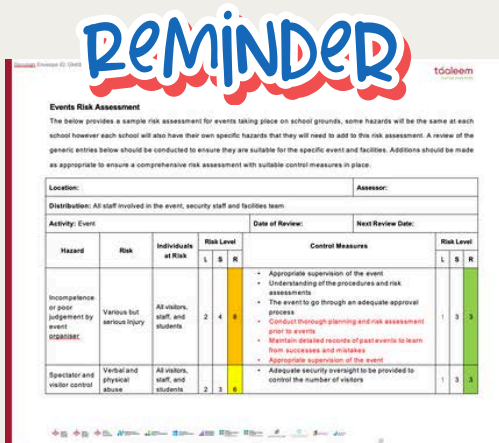
When planning any school event, trip, or activity, remember to:

Reminder: Nut-Free School Reminder

As part of our commitment to student safety, we remind all staff and parents that our school is a nut-free environment, a policy in place across all Taaleem schools. With a significant number of students having nut allergies, we kindly ask parents to ensure that no food containing nuts is included in their children's lunchboxes. This will help prevent any allergic reactions and ensure the safety of our students.



Reminder: PEEP for Students or Staff with Mobility Issues

This is a reminder to all staff to remain vigilant and ensure that any students or colleagues with casts or broken limbs affecting their mobility are promptly directed to the clinic. Parents are also reminded to inform the clinic if their child sustains an injury resulting in a cast or limited mobility. This will enable our nursing team to assess the situation and create a Personal Emergency Evacuation Plan (PEEP) to ensure the safety of affected individuals during emergency procedures.

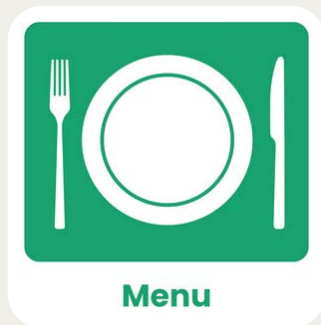
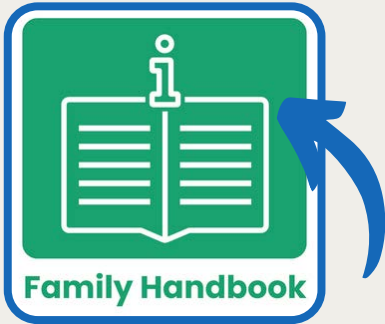
