A quick but important reminder before we dive in, starting Monday, we are introducing a small but significant update to our morning attendance procedures:

- Children must be in school and in class by 7.45am when the official register is taken.
- If your child arrives between 7.45-7.55am, they must go straight to class but will be marked late to school, but they do not need to collect a yellow slip from Reception.
- If your child arrives after 7.55am, they will have missed registration and must collect a yellow slip from Reception before going to class.
- Please note: there are slightly different arrangements for Mini and EY1 students, and for those who arrive late via the school bus. You can find all the details in our updated guide here: <u>School Attendance and Punctuality Reminder</u>.

This green initiative was introduced by our Principal, who made the commitment during one of the HSE Committee meetings last term, with the goal of reducing single-use waste across the school.

Staff members are encouraged to use their mugs for their morning coffee instead of paper cups. Those who go a full month without using a paper cup will receive a reward — such as a cookie, a snack, or even a free coffee!

Gate 1 Parking Arrangements and Timings – Effective Monday, 7th

Following staff feedback and a review of our traffic management processes, we are updating the access timings for Gate 1 (internal staff car park). These changes will take effect from Monday, 7th April.

Morning Access (06:00 - 07:20 AM)

- Gate 1 will be open for staff entry from 06:00 AM.
- As students are allowed into school from 07:00, there is overlap between staff vehicle movement and student arrivals.
- To mitigate this, Deepak (Head of Security) will manage pedestrian and vehicle movement inside Gate 1 between 07:00 – 07:20 AM to ensure safe entry.
- At 07:20, Gate 1 will close, and Deepak will move to Gate 4/5, where traffic management remains a key priority.
- Staff arriving after 07:20 will need to use alternative parking arrangements as Gate 1 access will not be permitted. Pedestrian access remains available.
- The other security personnel at Gate 1 will continue managing traffic outside the gate, including the Drop & Go area to assist parents.

Afternoon Access & Restrictions

- STRICTLY NO VEHICLE MOVEMENT between 14:40 15:30 inside the Gate 1 staff car park due to the high number of pedestrians at dismissal time.
- In the event of an emergency during this window, please contact our Facilities Manager Yazan Hammouda
- Gate 1 will open at 15:30 to allow staff vehicles to exit safely. Deepak and the security team will manage traffic in this area.
- On Fridays Gate 1 will open at 12:30 PM.

Key Considerations

These adjustments are aimed at improving both staff access and overall safety during busy times. While this change improves staff access, it also means that Deepak and our security team will be spending more time outdoors in the sun managing vehicle and pedestrian movement. We kindly ask for everyone's patience and cooperation in following security directions to help ensure the smooth operation of these changes.

As always, we will continue to regularly review our traffic management procedures.

Defensive Driving Training

In the last week of March, Mr. Santosh, our school driver and a valuable member of our Operations team, successfully completed a Defensive Driving Training course.

The training focused on safe driving practices and emphasized adherence to Abu Dhabi and UAE traffic regulations. This initiative supports our ongoing efforts to promote safety not just on campus, but beyond.

Reminder: Nut-Free School Reminder

During our routine review of the incident register over Spring Break, we noted a few occasions where students shared food items that contained nuts, which highlighted the importance of continued awareness around food allergies

We would like to remind everyone that our school is a nut-free campus.

Students must not bring or share any food items containing nuts to ensure the safety and well-being of all members of our school community.

Please help us reinforce this message with students and parents. Safety is a shared responsibility — and food allergies are serious.



Reminder: PEEP for Students or Staff with Mobility Issues

This is a reminder to all staff to remain vigilant and ensure that any students or colleagues with casts or broken limbs affecting their mobility are promptly directed to the clinic. Parents are also reminded to inform the clinic if their child sustains an injury resulting in a cast or limited mobility. This will enable our nursing team to assess the situation and create a Personal Emergency Evacuation Plan (PEEP) to ensure the safety of affected individuals during emergency procedures.


