What stood out most was their growing ability to think beyond themselves. In closing, I encouraged them to continue looking outward—considering how their learning and values can help shape a better world beyond our school.

I'd love to gently offer that same challenge to all our students:

- What kind of person do you want to be—not just here, but in the wider world?
- How will your values guide your choices, big and small?

This is exactly the kind of reflective, principled thinking we nurture through the IB learner profile, and it's such a joy to see it coming to life in such authentic ways.

The Values domain of the ADEK National Identity Framework encourages schools to embed core moral and civic principles—respect, compassion, tolerance, and responsibility—into all aspects of school life, aligning closely with both Emirati culture and the IB learner profile. At Raha, these values are woven through our curriculum and daily interactions.

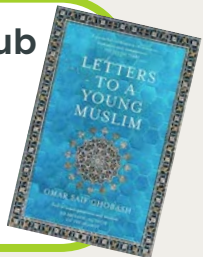

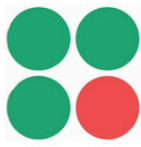

Visitor & Security Protocol Reminder

As part of our continued commitment to maintaining a safe and secure school environment, we kindly remind all staff—especially new team members—to strictly follow our lanyard and visitor supervision procedures.

Key Points to Remember:

- Black lanyards = Visitors – Must be accompanied at all times while on school premises.
- Red lanyards = Parents – Must also be accompanied at all times except during arrival and dismissal.
- No visitor or parent should be left unsupervised during the school day (7:00 AM – 4:30 PM).

Visitor Process:

- All visitors must sign in at security and collect a lanyard.
- No classroom access unless invited by a staff member.
- Visitors must wait in reception until collected.
- Only authorised personnel (e.g. government inspectors) may be unaccompanied.

These procedures are essential for ensuring safety and accountability across our campus.

A full communication, via email has also been shared by our Operations Manager, Mr. Shah Amin.



Phishing Awareness: Spot the Scam Before It Gets You

What is Phishing?

Phishing is an online scam where attackers pretend to be trusted sources (like banks or companies) to trick you into sharing sensitive information like passwords or bank details.

What Do Scammers Want?

- Passwords
- Credit/debit card numbers
- Bank and personal info
- Access to company or school systems

Common Phishing Methods:

1. Email: Fake emails urging quick action (e.g., "Your account will be locked!").
 - Red flags: Unknown sender, poor grammar, suspicious links, urgent tone.
2. Fake Websites: Look-alike sites that steal your login info.
 - Tip: Check the URL carefully—watch for small changes.
3. Social Media/Online Accounts: Fake messages, links, or friend requests pretending to be someone you know.
 - Stay alert: Don't trust unexpected requests or strange links.
4. Phone Calls & Texts (Vishing/Smishing): Scammers posing as banks or services asking for private info.
 - Warning signs: Unsolicited messages, urgent requests, unknown numbers.

How to Stay Safe:

- Double-check emails and links
- Don't click unless you're sure
- Watch for urgent language and spelling errors
- Contact companies directly if unsure

Remember: Phishing only works if you take the bait. Stay sharp and think before you click.

KCC Lanyard Policy

Please remember:

1. Lanyards must be worn and visible at all times whilst on school premises.
2. Challenge anyone not wearing a lanyard. Politely and respectfully ensure that any visitors or parents on the premises are wearing their lanyard visibly around their neck, not in their pockets.

Together, small actions make a big difference. **Before you leave—switch it off!**

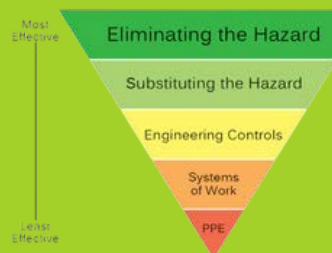
Health and Safety Reminders

Reminder: PEEP for Students or Staff with Mobility Issues

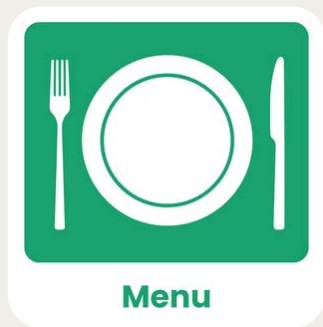
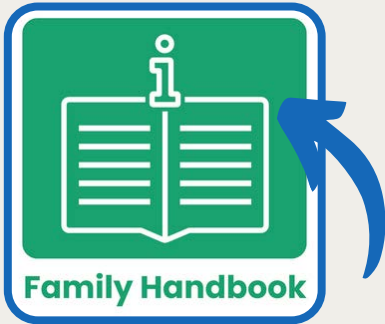

Parents are also reminded to inform the clinic if their child sustains an injury resulting in a cast or limited mobility. This will enable our nursing team to assess the situation and create a Personal Emergency Evacuation Plan (PEEP) to ensure the safety of affected individuals during emergency procedures.
