#### Did You Know?

Our school has always prioritized the health and safety of students and staff by continuously monitoring indoor air quality (IAQ) within our facilities. As part of our strategic commitment to Occupational Health and Safety, we have recently increased our focus on IAQ as a key factor in promoting wellbeing.

In collaboration with ADEK, regular assessments are carried out to measure critical air quality parameters inside the school, including carbon dioxide (CO<sub>2</sub>), carbon monoxide (CO), and relative humidity levels. These parameters are essential indicators of air circulation efficiency, the presence of pollutants, and overall ventilation performance.

Elevated levels of CO<sub>2</sub> can cause drowsiness, reduced concentration, and lower cognitive performance, especially in enclosed classrooms with many occupants. Meanwhile, even low concentrations of carbon monoxide pose serious health risks, making continuous detection and control crucial to prevent long-term exposure. Additionally, humidity levels—often overlooked—play a significant role in respiratory comfort and mold prevention. Low humidity can cause dryness and irritation, while high humidity creates conditions that promote microbial growth.

We are proud to report that our school remains within the recommended standard levels of  $CO_2$ , maintains 0 levels of CO, and consistently operates within normal humidity standards, ensuring a safe and comfortable learning environment for all.

By routinely monitoring these parameters and conducting indoor air testing, the school not only ensures compliance with ADEK guidelines but also takes a proactive approach to improving indoor environmental quality. The data collected guides targeted actions such as upgrading ventilation systems, optimizing HVAC settings, and implementing preventative maintenance measures.

Ultimately, maintaining healthy indoor air quality is not just about meeting regulatory requirements—it forms a foundational part of our vision to create a safe, supportive, and high-performing educational environment.



#### ISO 45001 Audit Preparations

As part of our ongoing commitment to maintaining the highest standards of occupational health and safety, kindly note that our school will undergo a comprehensive ISO 45001 audit on Thursday, June 12. The auditor will conduct a thorough evaluation encompassing both our physical site and relevant documentation to verify our compliance with mandated safety protocols.

Your unwavering cooperation and proactive engagement are critical to the successful outcome of this audit. I kindly urge each of you to remain vigilant and uphold exemplary safety practices throughout the campus.

#### Please pay special attention to the following key points:

- Maintain continuous and attentive supervision of all students while on school premises.
- Ensure that emergency exits, firefighting equipment (including fire hoses and extinguishers), stairwells, and all egress points remain completely unobstructed at all times. Storage or placement of any items in these areas is strictly prohibited.
- Keep all corridors, hallways, and pathways clear to facilitate safe and efficient movement throughout the facility.
- Encourage and assist students in properly storing their belongings—bags must be fully placed inside designated cubbies and never left partially out or on the floor, as this poses a significant trip hazard and detracts from our safety standards.

Please be advised that the auditor may conduct inspections in a range of areas including, but not limited to: classrooms, science laboratories, preparation rooms, the canteen, gymnasiums, swimming pool, playgrounds, school entry and exit gates, and clinic.

Your diligence and collaboration are paramount in not only ensuring a safe environment for all but also in showcasing our school's commitment to health and safety excellence.


